#### **Fundraising Activities**

- Book Sales are our largest source of revenue. Gail Wells and her small army of volunteers sell donated and used books through Amazon sales, the weekly MainStreet Farmers Market, and our quarterly book sales, recently renamed BAM! (Books and Media) Book Sales.
- Books donated from the community also get sold in our Bookstores at
- each Library branch, staffed whenever the Library is open by our very dedicated volunteers, and managed by Paula DeBell and Kathy Christy.
- In keeping with our tradition of holding two marquee-level fundraisers each year, the Friends held the Trivia Bee at the Junior Seau Beach Community Center on July 17, 2016, and the Afternoon Tea on the Civic Center Plaza on October 2, 2016.
- We created the new Board of Directors position of Fundraising Chair, and appointed Genevieve Wunder to the position in order to centralize and organize our fundraising and event planning activities.

## **Community Involvement**

The Friends of the Library do more than just fundraising: it also exists to support the Library through "community involvement and volunteer activities." Highlights for 2016 included:

- Helped library staff to host author visits and provided refreshments. Oceanside Public Library was honored with visits from authors Vanessa Diffenbaugh, Geraldine Brooks, Andrew Roe, and Victor Villaseñor.
- Held our second annual "Membership Appreciation" Event in October, in which wordsmith and humorist Richard Lederer gave a talk about Presidential trivia. Friends members enjoyed free refreshments at no cost during this National Friends of Libraries Week event, while we allowed new members to enroll for a limited time with a Buy One Membership, Get One Free special.
- Represented the Friends and the Library at community -wide events such as Art Walk and Sunset Market. In what is perhaps our most notable tradition. Suzanne Williams chauffeured Splash, the Library's mascot, in her convertible during the Freedom Days parade.
- Increased our involvement in other community activities, ramping up our presence to the nonprofit and business community around Oceanside and making an effort to attend more Chamber of Commerce functions.


