

## What's Better than a Bookstore? **Two Bookstores!** And thanks to the Friends of the Oceanside Public Library, you can shop at two bookstores, one at the Civic Center Library, and one at Mission Branch. The bookstores offer a variety of fiction, non-fiction, and children's books, CDs, DVDs, magazines and even an assortment of greeting cards. Most hardbacks are in the \$1 to \$3 range, and paperbacks sell at five for \$1 during our frequent sales. Children's books are usually half price, and CDs and DVDs: just \$1. The bookstores are maintained by the Friends of Oceanside Public Library and staffed by volunteers who can help you find a perfect stocking stuffer, birthday gift, no-reason gift and a gift for yourself. And every purchase is a gift to your community because it supports Oceanside Public Library's year-round programs, special events, books, materials, and media purchases and more. ### Alma's Things Considered THE LAYERS OF LIFE By Alma Sisco-Smith

Recently I reported for jury duty, and after we were dismissed at 11:45 AM I was drawn to a seating area outside the building – a large, tranquil garden.

I took out a newspaper that had been sent to me by a young man who was incarcerated in the Mule Creek State Prison, a facility in



lone, CA that houses about 4,100 prisoners. What an irony of taking this moment in this place to read a message from this individual. He had sent a note through the Friends of Oceanside Public Library after reading an earlier See Gull column

of mine. He'd said he found it inspiring and hopeful for him as he tutored other prisoners to read.

I was touched to see the beautiful and professional newspaper put together by various inmates.

My new acquaintance provided astonishing coverage of their performance of Shakespeare's *Julius Caesar* after a 32-week study with a Marin Theatre Group. Unbelievable! A description of each character in the play and the impact of playing those roles was artfully described, and it was heartening to read that each inmate felt enlightened from the experience.

Without knowing any of them, I felt proud for them and pleased that in that place and time, each had found value in the arts that helped them to "learn something of themselves."

And I felt a level of gratitude that a young man had found a way to establish contact with the public domain by reaching out through the Friends of the Oceanside Public Library and in turn engaging with me, thanks to the *See Gull*.

I closed the newspaper and pulled out my journal to make notes, to capture this moment of time and reflect on these new layers that had been added to my life.

I closed my eyes, felt blessed, and as they say in Costa Rica – *"Pura Vida!* Pure Life!"

# Here's the Story of...Here's the Glory of...



No matter how big the library or how large its funding, no library, anywhere, has *every* book, audiobook, CD or DVD its patrons want.

So aren't we lucky to have Link+?

With Link+ you can search hundreds of libraries in California for a book, audiobook, CD or DVD and if it's available, request it...

For free. And using Link+ is easy.

We launched Link+ in April and since then more than 4,000 items have been sent from other libraries to Oceanside Public Library patrons just like you.

They logged-on to their account, searched for the item, and when it wasn't at an Oceanside Public Library, they saw the image at the top right of this page.

So they clicked on the blue "Search and request from another library with Link+" and found the item, (middle image), then requested it (bottom image).

Here are more important things to know about Link+:

**Your item** generally arrives at the requested library in seven days or less.

**You can choose** where you want to pick up your item – the Civic Center Library or Mission Branch.

**Your loan time period** for books and most audiovisual material is 21 days with one possible renewal for an additional 21 days. Some DVDs have a seven-day loan period and are not renewable.

**You can check** the status of your Link+ request – just click on "My Account" and "Holds." The status will show as "INN-Reach REQUEST," "In Transit" or "Ready. Must pick up by (date)." You'll be notified by email or phone call that your item is available.

You can return your Link+ item to either Oceanside Public Library location.

In just a few days you can start enjoying reading, listening to or watching your Link+ requested item!

### Recommendations From the Archives: *Gaudy Night* by Dorothy L. Sayers $\uparrow \uparrow \uparrow \uparrow \uparrow \uparrow \uparrow$ (Five out of five stars)


One of the best-loved mystery writers from the past is Dorothy L. Sayers. Interested in what Oxford, England was like before the second world war? Want to get an idea of how life was lived in a woman's college at that time? Sayers' novel, *Gaudy Night*, copyright 1936, takes us into the mind of an intellectual English

woman, Miss Harriet Vane, who is being romantically pursued by Lord Peter Whimsey.

Miss Vane returns to Oxford for a reunion, called the Gaudy – and what follows is a knotty and elaborate puzzle, with humorous situations rife with perplexing clues.

Not an easy read, Sayers was interested in writing detective fiction that explored in exquisite depth the personalities of her characters and the details of the crime settings as well. The crimes in Sayers' fiction are secondary to the story, and arise from complex characteristics of the criminal – indeed, out of the human condition.

*Gaudy Night* is a stand-alone novel, but may be best enjoyed in the midst of other Sayers' novels featuring Whimsey and Vane such as *Strong Poison* (1930) and *Have His Carcase* (1932).

Born in 1893, Sayers was one of the first women to receive a degree from Oxford, finishing with first-class honors. Besides writing brilliant detective novels, she was a translator of classic works from Latin, wrote poetry, worked in a publishing firm and also as a teacher.

*Gaudy Night* is one of those classics you'll want to return to and read again and again in order to be immersed in another place and time, and to harvest clues you might have missed. You can order it from Link+, the Oceanside Public Library lending program featured in this issue of the *See Gull.*


# Spotlight On... Oceanside Public Library's Veterans' Connect Resource Center

This takes you to the Veterans' Resources page and a list of hotlines, along with links to San Diego County, California and Federal resources.



There's also a link to VetNow, a free online resource for VA Vetnow Benefits eligibility, community resources, job assistance and academic tutoring for veterans and their families.

Oceanside Public Library also offers on-site veterans' services at the Civic Center Library, 330 N. Coast Highway, second floor.

The Veterans' Connect Resource Center features books, brochures and other material on education, employment, housing, health, disability, and **Connect** other benefits that may be available for veterans and their families.


