Opening a used bookstore was a lot more complicated.

And it was a labor of love.

The Friends were already selling used books, DVDs and other items at their bookstores at the Civic Center and Mission Branch Libraries, at the Thursday Farmers Market, and through their Amazon Bookstore.

But when a storefront on Coast Highway became available, the Friends

Board went from asking "What if?" to

saying, "We can!"

The property is owned by Oceanside businessman George Cheadle, whose late wife Jane was a Friend and Library lover. Jane had been great friends with Evie Magaña, who is also a Friend.

Enter another Friend, Larry Hatter, who was acquainted with George. Larry connected George to Friends President Chris Wilson and Friends Board member Joe McCluskey, and the idea of a used bookstore that would honor both Jane and Evie's friendship, and their contribution to the Library, began to take shape.

A name was chosen: Jane and Evie's Used Books.

To which the Friends proudly added, "A Friends of the Oceanside Public Library Bookstore."

The decision-making process involved the entire Friends Board throughout, and Board members and store manager/volunteer Maggie Mula took the lead on not just opening "a store," but creating a welcoming space for customers to browse, buy, meet, and share their love of books.

Their to-do list included designing a floor plan, assembling and installing bookshelves, shelving countless boxes of sorted books, implementing an inventory control system, mastering the point-of-sale computer, furnishing Jane and Evie's Nook — a cozy corner for shoppers to sit and read — designing signage, and recruiting volunteer staff.

Lights, camera, action!

Jane and Evie's Used Books opened on March 7, 2022.

Now the Friends are planning a grand opening celebration, and Friends members will be the first to hear about it.

In the meantime, the Friends invite you to stop by Jane and Evie's Used Books – 323 N. Coast Highway, across the street from the Civic Center Library, open Monday through Saturday from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

ALMA'S THINGS CONSIDERED: The Value of Joy, Knowledge and Pride by Alma Sisco-Smith, Member, Library Board of Trustees

After three years, I'm writing no longer as President of the Library Board of Trustees. We've had the annual installations of new officers, and welcome them: President, Adrianne Hakes; Vice President, Charlene Williamson; and Secretary, Linda Arce. Yet, I am happy to continue to be on the Board – and since 2011! Two of my other

colleagues have been on the Board even longer. Obviously, the duration of these assignments are terms of endearment. Here is why, in my case.

In February, Black History Month kicked off with a collaboration between the Oceanside Museum of Art (OMA), Oceanside Public Library, and the North County African American Women's Association (NCAAWA). For the past 10 years NCAAWA and the Library have partnered with one another in recognition of this significant history. This year was the first for OMA as a partner and it could not have been more perfect. The spotlight was on Gordon Parks, whose career careened by leaps and bounds, bringing an awareness to the world of the art behind the photographic lens. Of his camera he said, "I chose my camera as a weapon against all the things I dislike about America – poverty, racism, discrimination."

THERE'S NOTHING SMALL ABOUT OUR MINI-LIBRARIES!

As part of its ongoing outreach to the community, Oceanside Public Library has opened two mini-libraries, with a third slated to open later this year.

The mini-libraries locations are Melba Bishop Recreation Center and El Corazon Senior Center, and the third location will be the Country Club Lane Senior Center. The project is a partnership that includes the Library, the Centers, and Oceanside Parks and Recreation. The project is coordinated by Library Division Manager CJ Di Mento and Recreation Supervisor Jesse Montanez.

The goal of the mini-libraries is to make the Library's collection more accessible to the community, and all Oceanside Public Library cardholders are welcome to check out mini-libraries materials. Cardholders may also request items from the Civic Center and Mission Branch Libraries for pickup at the mini-libraries.

The mini-libraries' curated collection includes books for all age groups, with an emphasis on items specific to Center needs. Center staff and Library volunteers are available to check out materials and assist customers as needed.

The current mini-libraries locations are:

Melba Bishop Recreation Center 5306 N. River Road, Oceanside Monday & Wednesday 9 a.m. to 7:30 p. m. Tuesday & Thursday 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Friday 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

El Corazon Senior Center 3302 Senior Center Drive, Oceanside Monday to Thursday 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Fridays 9 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The third mini-library will be located at:

Saturday 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.

Country Club Lane Senior Center 455 Country Club Lane, Oceanside

In addition to the new mini-libraries, the Centers receive weekly visits from the Library's Bookmobile, offering resources to cardholders that include books, DVDs, computer access, and special programs for all ages.



Oceanside residents who don't have a Library card can apply in-person at all locations including the minilibraries, or on the Library website <u>Library Services</u> tab. Students in the Oceanside and Vista Unified school Districts can use their Student ID as their Library card.

The mini-libraries are sponsored in part by the Oceanside Public Library Foundation and the Friends of the Oceanside Public Library.

No single article could encompass retiring volunteer Gail Wells' contributions to Oceanside Public Library and our community.

But the Friends want to use this space to acknowledge – and express our gratitude for – the time Gail so generously gave us, the energy she devoted to the Library, and the inspiration she provided for so many.

Gail began volunteering for the Library in 2005, and the very next year was named
Friends Volunteer of the Year for the numerous hours she was spending in the Friends' Book Sorting
Facility, where she and her team selected donated books to sell in the Library bookstores, the Friends Big
Book Sales, their booth at the Thursday Farmers Market, and the Friends Amazon Bookstore.

Gail also served on the Friends Board of Directors, and her volunteering time grew, sometimes to more than 2,000 hours per year – the equivalent of a full-time job. Under her leadership the Friends sales of used books, DVDs and other items increased to earn more than \$100,000 per year, a critical source of revenue supporting the Library's events and programs for all ages, the purchase of materials, and technology upgrades.

When Gail was featured in the Spring 2021 *See Gull* she said that volunteering "was a good decision for me." It was also a decision that has – and will continue to – enrich the lives of bookstore shoppers, Library customers, and the entire Oceanside community.

Blake's contribution has been far from "small," and will continue to make a big difference.

CHECK OUT THESE LIBRARY OPPORTUNITIES FOR TEENS

Oceanside Public Library has long offered an opportunity for students to earn community service hours, and we're grateful that so many talented and hardworking teens have chosen to give their time to the Library.

When the pandemic hit, the Library made the commitment to continue providing that opportunity for teens, even as many other volunteer options became unavailable. Virtual volunteering has been such a success that the Library now offers *both* virtual and in-person opportunities in its **Teen Partner** program.

Teen Partners must be students between ages 14-18 who, in addition to earning community service hours, want to help the Library and their community, gain work experience, and even make new friends. Virtual volunteering may include creating book lists, writing book reviews, planning programs, and uploading posts to social media. In-person volunteering can mean organizing books, creating Library displays, preparing crafts for kids programs, and helping with those and other programs.



The Library makes it easy for Teen Partners, and those interested in becoming Teen Partners, to learn more via monthly Zoom meetings on the second Tuesday of each month at 4 p.m. It's a place for teens to meet each other, socialize, learn about specific volunteer activities, discuss assignments, and ask questions like "How do I turn in assignments?" and, "How do I get my hours for school"?

Another opportunity for teens is **Teens Work Internships**, also for students ages 14-18. These paid positions help teens gain job experience and realize their potential by taking on leadership roles in the Library, working on committees, and overseeing projects; assignments could include social media, programming, photography, and outreach responsibilities.

Interns also participate in trainings on social-emotional wellness and related skills, and host youth programs focused on these same skills, which are critical in all aspects of life including the work environment. They'll have opportunities to practice soft skills including teamwork, creativity, problem-solving, effective communication, dependability, and empathy.

The internship period is 12 weeks, 15 hours per week, and a work permit is required. Apply through the City of Oceanside employment opportunity page.





HOMEWORK HELPER RESUMES AND VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED

After discontinuing Homework Helpers due to the pandemic, Oceanside Public Library is resuming this muchneeded youth program beginning April 11 and continuing through June 2 on Tuesdays at the Civic Center Library, and on Thursdays at the Mission Branch Library.

Volunteers are needed to help children in grades K-8 in a range of subjects – reading, writing, math, social studies and science – from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m., one day a week at either Library. Experience working with children in a school or educational-type setting is preferred but not required. Volunteers must be willing to commit through the beginning of June 2022, and attend an orientation to review program procedures and expectations.

COOKING WITH FRIENDS

by Genevieve Wunder, Friends Board Member Microwave Bread Pudding – Single Cup Serving

Enjoy with a glass of milk or a cup of tea...you can even add ice cream on top...yummy, yummy!

3 slices of bread 1 Tbsp sugar 1/8 tsp cinnamon 1/3 cup raisins 1 egg 1/2 cup milk 1/4 tsp vanilla Sprinkle of nutmeg

Instructions:

- 1. Cut bread into cubes.
- 2. Create mixture in a small bowl and whisk: Egg, sugar, milk, cinnamon, vanilla.
- 3. Add raisins to bread.
- 4. Place bread/raisins in a large cup.
- 5. Pour mixture over bread. Make sure all bread is coated.
- 6. Place in microwave for 1 minute, check if the egg mixture is set. Use a fork to pull the bread away from the sides to make sure there is no pool of egg in the bottom. Also check center.
- 7. If needed, microwave for another 30 seconds and check again.
- 8. Continue to microwave at additional 15 second intervals until mixture is set. (Microwave wattages vary)
- 9. Sprinkle top with nutmeg.

ARE YOU CRAZY FOR CROCHET, KNUTTY FOR KNITTING, OR EXCITED ABOUT EMBROIDERY?

If you're an adult or teen who loves to knit, crochet and/or embroider, Oceanside Public Library invites you to join their in-person Twisted Stitches Yarn Club, a creative space for beginners to experts to ask questions, share knowledge, and enjoy these old crafts in new ways.



The program is held on the third Tuesday of each month from 4:30 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., in the Civic Center Library Foundation Room, and needles and hooks are available to borrow. Whether you want to try a new hobby or have current projects to finish, this is a creative space to learn together without the structure of a class (though some instructional materials are provided), and all are welcome to drop in, or to stay for the whole program.



You'll also have the opportunity to make a difference by using your talents to crochet or knit 7" x 9" squares for the Warm Up America Foundation, a national nonprofit that since 1991 has provided hand-knitted and crocheted blankets, clothing and accessories made by volunteers across the country and donated to people in need.

The foundation assembles your squares and gives the blankets (pictured) to a variety of organizations including women's shelters, nursing homes, hospitals and hospices. This project is optional and can be done at the Library and at home.

LINK+ CELEBRATES THIRD ANNIVERSARY BY ADDING MORE LIBRARIES!

Oceanside Public Library began offering our *free* LINK+ service in April 2019 and since then, Library customers have requested thousands of books and other items from libraries all over California.



The process is easy – just search for your item in the Library's online catalog and if the item isn't in our collection, you'll see a link that says, "Search & request from another library with LINK+." If your item is available on LINK+, you'll see a list of libraries that have it. Click the "Request" button, select "Oceanside Public Library," select your delivery choice – Civic Center Library, Mission Branch or Home Delivery – and in about a week the item is in your hands.

And now, according to Library Technology Analyst Sam Liston, LINK+ will soon be available from and to the entire Serra Cooperative Library System in San Diego and Imperial Counties, "bringing new collections to Oceanside cardholders."

He worked with then-Imperial County Library Director Crystal Duran and secured a budget appropriation to fund a variety of services for the Imperial County Libraries – including money to make the shared approach to LINK+ a reality. My long-standing dream has come true!"
