
SHOP...AT THE LIBRARY? YES, YOU CAN!

And every week, all the bookstores receive six to eight boxes of new donations so there's always fresh inventory to peruse and purchase.

Teen Partners volunteer both virtually and on-site; here they're making journal kits that the Library gave away during September's Community-wide Health and Well-Being initiative.

Your donations also took another form: You expanded the Library's collection by participating in the Gift Book Program to memorialize or honor family or friends, celebrate major holidays or life events, and recognize organizations. A bookplate placed inside the book distinguishes it as a tribute, and a gift that keeps on giving – to the many Library customers who borrow and enjoy it in the future.

You also invited us to visit your organizations and to attend events with information, or as speakers, and requested services such as bookmobile visits. You welcomed us – and the Library welcomed these opportunities to connect with our community.

And now we come to our amazing Friends and friends who volunteered in 2022, giving thousands of hours of their time, plus their talent and skills, in so many capacities: serving on a Library Board; providing customer service at the Friends' bookstores; helping

with fundraisers and in the Friends' book sorting facility; assisting in other areas ranging from Homework Helpers and literacy tutors to keeping the Friends' website, Facebook and Instagram accounts updated.

Plus a special shout-out to the Library's Teen Partner volunteers, who brought fresh, valuable perspectives to the many tasks they tackled. In FY 2021-2022, 59 teens gave 1,640 hours, much of that on virtual projects. Those projects included creating a multitude of booklists that the Library uses for in-person recommendations or social media posts; book reviews in video and print; planning and running programs such as Teen Book Clubs; researching and planning crafts for children; putting together take-home craft kits for children, and more.

And deep inside the costume of the Library's SPLASH mascot often beats the heart of...a volunteer.

For more than 50 years, the Friends have been committed to supporting Oceanside Public Library's mission: **to engage, inform, connect and inspire**.

In October the Friends of the Oceanside Public Library proudly presented a \$56,000 check to CJ Di Mento, Library Director. The check represented Friends' support of Library programming and the purchase of new books and materials for the first half of 2022; additional funding brought the Friends' total 2022 support to \$89,000 for the year.

WHO SAYS, "GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES"? THE FRIENDS!

Oceanside Public Library recently celebrated the opening of a third mini-library, located at the Country Club Senior Center.

The goal of the mini-libraries is to make Library resources more accessible to the community, and the curated collections include books for all age groups, with an emphasis on items specific to each center's needs.

All Oceanside Public Library cardholders are welcome to check out mini-library materials, and cardholders may also request items from the Civic Center and Mission Branch Libraries for pickup at the mini-libraries. Center staff and Library volunteers are available to check out materials and assist customers as needed.


WHAT IS BOOKS@HOME?


If you (or someone you know) have a physical condition and cannot come to Oceanside Public Library, and would like personalized materials, you may be eligible for the Library's Books@Home service. Available materials are books including large-type, Braille Talking Books and the book player, audiobooks, music CDs and magazines.

To be eligible for Books@Home you:

- · Are an adult Oceanside resident.
- Are temporarily or permanently confined to your home due to illness or disability.
- Are unable to get to the Library and don't have someone available to bring Library materials to you.
- Have a current Oceanside Public Library card (if not, Library staff can help you obtain one).



Did you know that the Civic Center Library has a 3D printer that you can use – for free?

The Friends know – because their support is one reason why using this resource *is* free!

If you're new to the world of 3D printing or would like to further your acquaintance, the Friends invite you to register for the Intro to 3D class (registration and attendance are required) on the first Monday of the month at 5 p. m. at the Civic Center Library Foundation Room. The class is conducted by Israel Marroquin, Adult Services Librarian, who said, "The class I teach covers just enough to get one started."

"Most people who use the Library's 3D printer are not regular users; they're mainly people exploring the world of 3D printing to see if it's something they're interested in. 3D printing tends to be technical in nature and requires a great deal of know-how and experience. And a significant amount of time – most print jobs can take all day."

Israel noted that because of the steep learning curve, Library staff are not available to assist with the use of the 3D printer, but "There are a few staff who are experienced, and when available we are happy to help. 3D printing is meant as a do-it-yourself resource."

One-Pan Dessert: Fruit Cobbler

2 cans pineapple chunks

1 bag frozen whole strawberries

1 box Duncan Hines Pineapple Supreme Cake Mix Sprinkle of sea salt

1 stick butter, cut into squares

- 1. Spray a 9x13 baking dish with non-stick spray.
- 2. Drain most of the juice from the cans of pineapple and pour pineapple into pan.
- 3. Place frozen strawberries on top of pineapple.
- 4. Sprinkle 3/4 box of cake mix on top of the fruit.
- 5. Place cut butter squares on top 3 across/4 down rows over cake mix.
- 6. Bake at 350 degrees for 30-45 minutes or until top is golden brown.

BRAILLE TALKING BOOKS...BROUGHT TO YOU BY THE FRIENDS

For those of us who learned to read at a young age, it's as if we've *always* been able to read. Whether it's a novel or poetry or text book, we read without even thinking about it.

But what if you're visually impaired? How do you enjoy the pleasure that many of us take for granted: Books.

Oceanside Public Library offers Braille Talking Books, the *only* library in North County to do so. Defiance
Defiance
Hobbs, 63151

According to Trista Tabanico,

Adult Services Librarian II, "Talking Books from the Braille Institute are always available to cardholders at the Civic Center and Mission Branch Libraries. We have 100 Talking Books at any given time, 50 at each Library."

"Every month we receive 50 new Talking Books and I integrate the new books in and rotate out some of the older books. If a patron has a specific reading request, I can order it for them. I also provide information

about other resources they can access from the Braille Institute."

Braille Talking Books are on display at the Civic Center Library (above) and Mission Branch Library. Each Library offers a rotating collection of 50 books.

The Braille Institute of America (BIA) is a nonprofit organization founded in 1912 in Los Angeles. According to their website, BIA offers "a wide array of programs and services that are designed to help people who are blind or visually impaired lead enriched and fulfilling lives."

Braille Talking Books aren't listed in the Library's catalog, so the borrowing process starts with contacting Trista (760-435-5600). The Library provides a digital talking-book player, and the book is on a memory card with the title and author in both Braille and English (pictured above). While the collection does include some books for Young Adults, most are for adults, and genres include fiction, nonfiction, mysteries, fantasy, westerns, biographies, readings of the Bible,

history, poetry, science fiction – "a little bit of something for everyone," said Trista.

The customer can pick up the player and book, or they can designate someone to do this. "Just let us know who will be picking up at the preferred location, and we'll have the items at the service desk with the name of the cardholder or their designee. Borrowers can keep the player for as long as they need, and borrow and return as many books as they want."

The Friends of the Oceanside Public Library are proud to sponsor Braille Talking Books, and Friends President Chris Wilson says, "We support the Library's vision of literacy and information access for everyone in our community, and that inclusiveness includes this wonderful resource. We want to get the word out about it!"

HOOPLA IS A HIT WITH KIDS – AND IT'S FREE!

Monica Chapa-Domercq, Oceanside Public Library's Principal Librarian, recently shared that "Oceanside Public Library has one of the highest circulation rates of children's material in California!"

"Audiobooks from Hoopla are especially popular with kids. And," she added, "with adults as well."

What is Hoopla?

Hoopla is a library media streaming platform for audiobooks, e-books, TV programs, comics, music, and movies (including kids-friendly movies). This Library resource is *free* to cardholders and can be enjoyed everywhere you have a screen: on your TV, computer, phone, and in your car. Hoopla syncs across all your devices so you can stream titles immediately, and most titles can also be downloaded to your phone or tablet.

In addition to Hoopla, the Library's free eresources include Libby, Flipster, Mango Languages and more. All you need is an Oceanside Public Library card; if you don't have one, apply in-person at any Library or bookmobile location, or apply for a digital Library card by clicking here.

As for the future of 3D printing, said Israel, "3D technology is still in its infancy, and some consumer-level models are launching later this year. But they'll still require a lot of expertise to use them."

"It will be a long while before the technology develops where things work at the push of a button. Until then,

we'll keep offering classes and hoping people adopt the technology and learn how to use it. Then they'll be ready when the technology breakthroughs come, and 3D printers become as common as microwaves – and just as easy to use!"
